CROP EXHIBIT RULES RULES

- A. Entries in each of the following classes are limited to one each by any one individual, with the exception of Section B "Beef", which is limited only by available space.
- B. All exhibits must have been produced by members of FFA as a part of their supervised agricultural experience program.
- C. Containers for all vegetable exhibits shall be provided, with the exception of the vegetable display.
- **FFA Office.** The arrangement of the display as well as the quality of the vegetables will be considered by the judge.
- D. All exhibits of forage crops shall consist of **one standard bale**.
- E. Tobacco exhibits will consist of a single stalk of tobacco as cut from the field. The stalk must contain all the leaves.
- F. Potato exhibits shall not be washed. This will result in disqualification. The potatoes should be cleaned by use of a brush.
- G. Fruits and vegetables should NOT be washed.
- H. Officials reserve the right to screen exhibits for quality. Unsound or inferior quality exhibits will be disqualified and discarded.
